



## ADANSONIA DIGITATA

The *Adansonia digitata*, famously known as the African Baobab or "Tree of Life," is a prehistoric-looking deciduous tree recognized by its massive, water-storing trunk and root-like branches. Native to the arid savannas of sub-Saharan Africa, it is one of the longest-living organisms on Earth, often surviving for thousands of years. 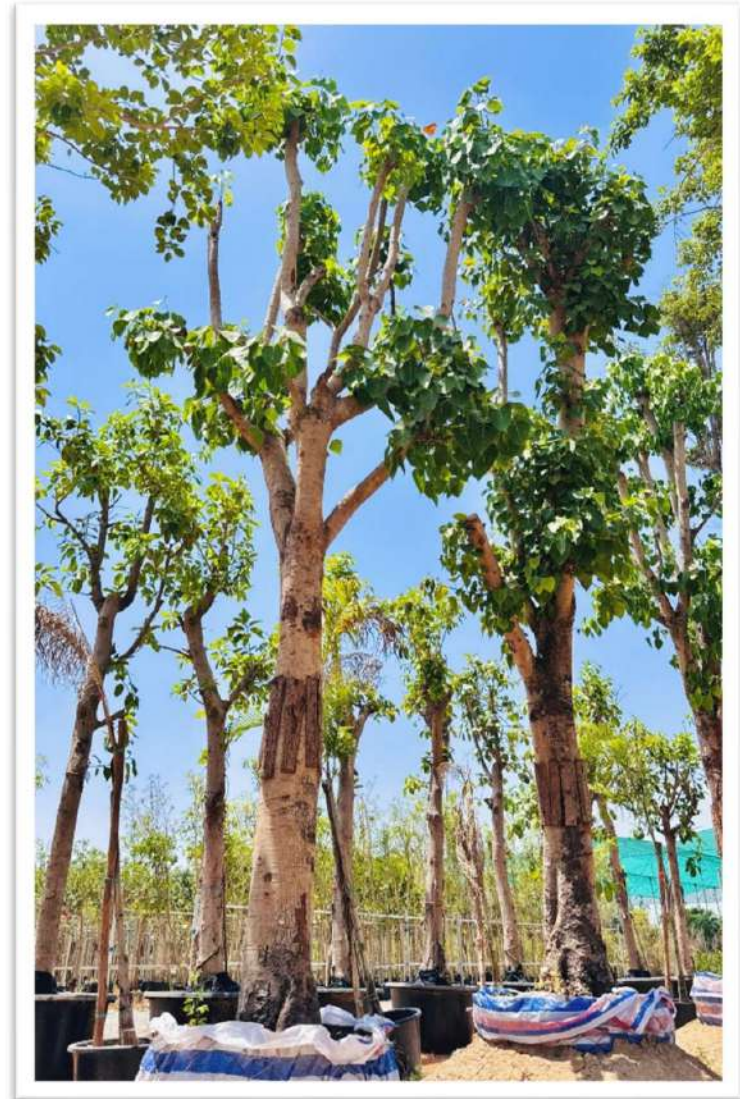

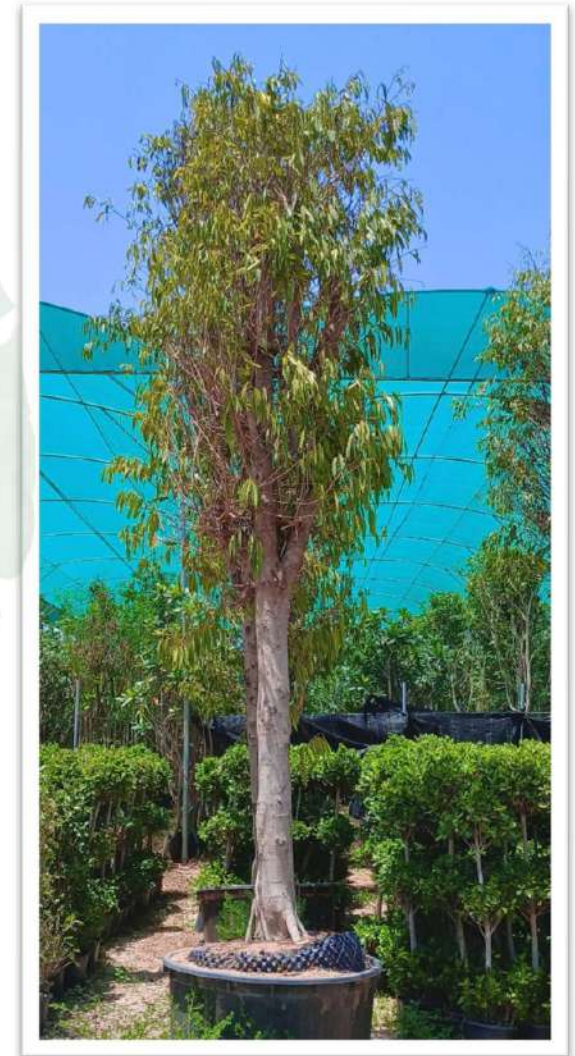
## FICUS ALTISSIMA

## ZAMIA FURFURACEA

**Zamia furfuracea, commonly known as the Cardboard Palm, is a slow-growing, prehistoric-looking cycad native to eastern Mexico that produces a symmetrical rosette of stiff, arching fronds. Despite its name, it is not a true palm but a gymnosperm characterized by leathery, olive-green leaflets with a coarse, fuzzy texture reminiscent of cardboard. The plant typically develops a short, stout trunk that can remain partially subterranean, reaching a mature height of about 3 to 4 feet with a wide, spreading crown.**
